

There is a name stone in the front of the building which was purchased from Armstrongs of Highfield Farm. When finished, the hall will be available for hire for community groups and Parish Council meetings. It will be a great asset for the village.

COPPULL NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN UPDATE



The Steering Group received confirmation that the funding from Locality (Government organisation that funds Neighbourhood Plans)had been released at the end of July 2023 for the year 2023/2024. This was welcome news, and we are in the process of finalising our grant application.

Once the funding is secured it is all systems go and, with the guidance of the Planning Consultant, we shall endeavour to produce a draft plan for submission to Chorley Council and subsequent publication for review to the residents of Coppull in the new year.

There will be large amounts of work to be done to meet the target date and, as a Steering Group with the full support of the Parish Council, we are committed to achieving this.

Please consider getting involved, even if you feel you may not have any relevant experience or understanding, we still need people to do research and surveys to complete the plan. An hour or two will make a welcome contribution to the Steering Group, we'd love to have you on board.





COPPULL CLEAN UP CREW

We are fortunate to have the services of the three Parish Council Lengthsmen (one full-time, two part-time) who do a marvellous job keeping on top of the litter deposited on the streets of Coppull, but there are certain areas that are not covered by them, for example the woods and paths between Coppull (from the Mill) and Charnock Richard exiting at

Freeman's Lane.



There is a continuous problem of numerous discarded beer cans and general detritus left behind by both individuals and groups of young people either passing between the two villages or having meet ups in the woods. Additionally, discarded dog waste bags are found hanging from the railings on the

upper path and there are literally hundreds of beer cans and Spar plastic bags on the railway side of

the railings.

At the Leisure Centre we are so fortunate to have the young ladies from the Trampoline Academy who, along with Steven (Coach and Centre Hall Manager), carry out a regular litter pick routinely, clearing up most days on the weekend as well

as during the week. This is in addition to the work done by the Parish

Council Lengthsmen, Tony, Sven and Chris.



On my daily walks with my personal trainer (my Springer Spaniel) I have met many people who like myself pick up what we can, but there is no joined up organised group to tackle problems like this, unlike the groups that exist at Chisnall or Lower Burgh Meadows.

Therefore, I wish to propose the formation of a volunteer group to carry out targeted litter picks and general clear ups in areas such as mentioned above and any "Grot Spots" that may be

reported either directly to the group or via the Parish Council Office.

It would be great if we could co-ordinate the efforts of individuals and at the same time encourage other public spirited people to become involved. The Parish Council have agreed to support a group like this. This would be in the form of supplying any necessary aids such as litter pickers, high-vis vests, gloves, bags and hand gel.

Any organised litter picks would have to be planned and a risk assessment would be undertaken, taking into account, busy roads, water hazards, slippery grass slopes, trip hazards, broken glass, hogweed, insecticides, syringes, clinical waste, etc.

Health & Safety

Prior to any large-scale event we would ensure there is a first aid kit available and that the group are briefed on how to safely use any equipment used.

Hazardous waste

We would ensure all participants are aware not to pick up potentially hazardous objects such as unidentified canisters or heavy objects that could cause injury. If any dangerous or hazardous items are present, the Environment Agency should be contacted.

Children

All children taking part would have to be accompanied by an adult, supervised at all times and notified clearly about the items of waste to leave alone. They should not pick up for more than an hour without a break

Recording attendees

A list of volunteers attending the event would be kept for reference on council files.

Public and employers' liability insurance.

If a litter pick is a council run event it would be covered by the council's insurance policy, including cover for volunteers under the Council's employers liability insurance. If, however, the council is merely providing litter-picking kits and/or collecting the waste at the end of the events for individually organised events, insurance cover is down to those participating, but not compulsory.

It would be great to get younger members of the community involved in events such as this and hopefully some of the local schools would be interested in participating.

Grot-spot surveillance

Walking around the village with my personal trainer (Springer Spaniel), I have come to the conclusion that we have some real "grot spots" that are blighted by irresponsible dog owners failing to pick up after their dogs and litter louts who think Coppull is their own private rubbish dump.

The two worst places are the ginnels that run from the Spar roundabout to the Printer's pub and the ginnel beside the eyesore of the BT building. Both of these



ginnels are cleared on a weekly basis by the Council Lengthsmen and they do a great job, but within a day or two they are back to the usual grotty state. There are obviously a few repeat offenders who just don't care what they drop and where.

Case in point is the person who walks down the ginnel to Spar every day, smokes his last cigarette and drops the empty packet, usually within ten feet of the bin, carries on to Spar

and buys his next packet of Embassy Regal. I know this because I have picked up the empty packet nearly every other day for the past two years!

COPPULL UTD FC - The Last Club Standing



A quick look at Coppull's history of the last 100 years will tell you the village grew up on coal mining and cotton spinning, with most villagers employed in this work. What is also evident is football was the major pastime. Over the past 100 years records show no fewer than 26 different football clubs have represented the village, playing on seven different pitches that we know of.

Today the village has doubled in size, but with this growth and development all the football pitches have disappeared, except one, Coppull United, Blainscough Park, Springfield Road. The Last Club Standing. It is not just a football club, but a community hub where our clubroom facilities are used by various organisations and the ground used for charity events throughout the year. Matches are played Saturdays and Sundays with evening games early and late in the season.



To give opportunity to more youngsters in the village, the clubs dedicated and unpaid volunteers, managers, coaches and playing staff have this season started Under 7's, 8's and 16's teams. It is hoped they will add to the successes of our First team who are Lancashire Amateur Shield Winners and have 20 consecutive seasons in the West Lancs Premier Division. Our newly promoted Reserves who have performed well and finished in the top half of their new division. Our Under 21's, who stepped up massively from Under 18 age group and reached the final of the Under 21's Combination Cup in their first season. The club also host Chorley Ladies FC 1st team on Sundays which further adds to the clubs inclusiveness

We are always grateful to the people who come down to support us. Just buying food, a drink or raffle ticket helps the clubs finances on the day. Financial support is offered to the club from individuals and businesses throughout the season in various ways. From our 100 club numbers at £5 per month, hire of the clubroom, sponsorship of matches, players, kit or just a donation all are greatly appreciated. Every little helps.

Even if you are not interested in football why not get yourself down for an afternoon to different surroundings and people for a chat. Give it a try and support The Last Club Standing. You never know you may enjoy


